MAMCA's Bruce A. Harrison Outstanding Student Award is presented by the association to recognize the accomplishments and contributions of a student pursuing a degree relating to mosquito control or systematics, vector-borne disease, or related discipline that the Association deems appropriate. The award recipient must be a resident of one of MAMCA's member states or must be attending a school of higher learning in one of MAMCA's member states. The MAMCA member states include Delaware, Georgia, Maryland, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia.

The award recipient will be an invited guest of the Association and will present their research project to the Association at the annual conference. A \$500.00 award will be presented to the recipient at the annual conference. MAMCA will also provide limited compensation for hotel accommodations; costs associated with the annual meeting registration, and ground transportation expenses.
